THEIR first entry into a display village is the latest step for a Border company that has collected eight building awards during the past three years.

Directors James and Tom Komadina say their previous displays have stood alone, but this time they decided to join a development's village.

"It allows people to compare our product with the others because they're so close together," James Komadina says.

Built to a new plan, the Meridian offers 25.74 squares under roof and 19.14 squares of living.

There are four bedrooms, although the front bedroom could be adapted into a study if preferred.

"This plan was designed for modern family litestyle," Tom Komadina says.

"It's got integrated open living areas which basically allow family members to do their own thing, but still be connected."

The separate lounge room provides one example of this, as it could be closed off with sliding doors or turned into a children's play area

that is easy to supervise for anyone working in the kitchen.

Similarly the open-plan dining and family area flows smoothly into the alfresco section, an advantage when entertaining a crowd.

Features of the kitchen include a walk-in pantry, a large island bench and a mirrored splashback.

The main bedroom is tucked away for privacy and has an en suite with a separate toilet, a spacious shower and dual vanities.

Rather than the conventional walk-in wardrobe, there is ample built-in his and hers storage that demonstrates a new style of mirrored door.

"This combination probably has more hanging space anyway, so it's not a bad thing," James Komadina says

"And then you've got the added bonus of good mirrors to get dressed in front of as well."

"It's a luxurious parents' area," his brother adds.

The other two bedrooms lie in a wing off the central hub that also houses the main bathroom, laundry and a separate toilet.

Columns and square set ceilings form part of the construction.

Ducted heating and cooling aim to provide comfort for residents all year round.

Tom Komadina says this design may appeal to families or couples that enjoy entertaining, but the company can also create specific plans to suit individual needs.
